Director's Notes —

Sci-fi author Terry Pratchett said "Seeing, contrary to popular wisdom, isn't believing. It's where belief stops because it isn't needed any more."

When individuals stuck at home and bored start to channel surf on the latest technology, they happen upon the *War of the Worlds*, a radio play by Orson Welles. In dramatized form as a series of news bulletins and radio interludes, the listener begins to believe that the country is under attack from an invader from the outside. They don't need to see it outside their windows.

This year that we have recently completed in various stages of quarantine and social distancing has been a challenge to many parts of society. Perhaps even some are thinking that we are under attack from the outside. We have evolved how we work, interact with friends, and even how we do theatre. When the Elmhurst History Museum approached us about partnering to do this production, I was thrilled. What a fantastic way to bring the new idea of a virtual play and meld it with the old style of a radio drama!

Several moments in the play made us pause and take note of the parallels to current times.

- Stranger says to Pierson, "There won't be any more concerts for a million years or so, and no nice little dinners at restaurants."
- The Secretary of the Interior's address to the nation struck a chord after January 6th.

It is a different world than it was 13 months ago. Maybe we'll return to "normal" activities, or maybe we'll change as we've learned about ourselves a little more this year.

It was a wonderful experience to gather this stellar cast together as we rehearsed over Zoom and shared our common love of theatre. We hope you enjoy!


